Description: The Terrorism/Major Event Preparedness Workshop is a 12-hour course that provides individuals with overview training on the entire spectrum of preparedness for a terrorist and/or major natural/man-made event. The workshop provides instruction on the Command Systems (ICS/NIMS/MAC) coupled with federal response; an examination of the complexities of operational considerations and actions during command of a major event; pre and post planning considerations utilizing techniques which determine the correct composition of the planning team; evaluating the threat to the jurisdiction; identifying and prioritizing probable targets; measuring required capabilities; and the tools to developing a local Incident Response Plan (IRP) for a major event incident. The workshop culminates with the responder participating in a four-hour tabletop exercise using the materials developed in the previous sessions to plan for and command the emergency response resources at the incident site.

Audience: First and Second Responders, Emergency response supervisors, managers, staff and community leaders from the following disciplines/functional areas are encouraged to attend this workshop: Public Safety Communications, Law Enforcement, Fire Service, Emergency Medical Service, Hazardous Materials, Health Care, Governmental Administrative, Public Health, Public Works, Emergency Management, Education, School Planers, and Private Entities.
